Saints Days: August 2016

06 : Transfiguration of our Lord. This story is told by Matthew, Mark and Luke. Peter also refers to it in his second epistle. It emphasises that God's salvation is for all, and that Christ is the one who brings that salvation. Moses and Elijah represent the testimony of the law and the prophets. The event also gives a foretaste of the life of glory promised by the resurrection.

15:Blessed Virgin Mary: Mary was a young Jewish girl living in Nazareth. She was visited by a messenger from the Lord, telling her that she would be the bearer of the Son of God to the world. She replied, "Let it be to me according to your word" This showed her natural sense of obedience to God and her reverence for his word. She was truly worthy of such an honour. This day is celebrated throughout most of the Christian world as her major feast day.

24: Bartholomew; It has been assumed, but not verified, that Bartholomew and Nathanael are one and the same person. Philip brought Nathanael to Jesus, calling him an Israelite worthy of the name. He is also present beside the Sea of Galilee at the resurrection. He initially appears to be a cynic, but recognises Jesus for who he is, and proclaims him as the Son of God and King of Israel.

Kevin's Place to Pray for.....

Usually I suggest a place to pray for. This month I am asking us all to find a place that we are comfortable in praying in. This can be an armchair, a quiet place at home, in the garden or on the beach. It could also be in one of our churches, like in St David's Chapel for example. Having a comfortable place helps cultivate regular prayer.
