Saints Days February 2016

01: St Brigid / Bride / Ffraid: She was a contemporary of St Patrick, and founded a religious community in Kildare. A remarkable woman, who earned her place in the male dominated list of saints in the Irish Celtic church, she was almost regarded as the second patron saint. Legend claims she was carried over the Irish Sea, and arrived at Trearddur Bay beach, on a square of green turf.

02: Candlemass: The presentation of Christ in the Temple. Mary and Joseph took the 40 day old baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem. Under Levitical Law, Mary was required to be 'cleansed' or purified, having given birth to a male child. Until that was done she could touch no holy thing, nor enter the sanctuary. On seeing the Holy Family, Simeon praised God and the prophet Anna gave thanks. The image of Christ as the Light of the World is celebrated with candles, just as light overcomes the darkness.

03: Seiriol: During the first half of the 6th century, he became the founder and first Abbot of Penmon in Anglesey. Tradition has it that he and his soul friend Cybi, would meet at midday to talk and pray together, at the wells of Clorach half way across the island.
