Saints Days November 2015

01: All Saints Day

The celebration of the feast of All Saints began in the 4th century, and has been observed in England, Wales and Ireland since the 9th century.

02: All Souls Day

In Christ, all the faithful, both the living and the departed, are bound together in a communion of prayer

04: Gwenfaen

Gwenfaen was the daughter of Pawl Hen of Manaw (Isle of Man), who made her cloister in Rhoscolyn. Legend has it that Gwenfaen, was chased away from her cell by druids and escaped by climbing the rock stack off Rhoscolyn head. The tide came in and she was carried away by angels, which is how Saints Bay got its name. The water of St Gwenfaen's Well, is credited with curing mental problems, in return for an offering of two white quartz pebbles.

<u>05: Cybi</u>

Cybi was born in Cornwall about 485 AD. He studied extensively and after some years spent as a travelling pilgrim, he eventually came to Wales to visit his cousin David. He established his principal monastery at Caergybi. Folk tradition tells that he regularly travelled to Clorach in the centre of Anglesey to meet his great friend Seiriol, whose monastery was at Penmon. Cybi was a forthright fiery character who died in Holyhead, and is believed to have been buried near Eglwys y Bedd, in the grounds of the church which takes his name.

30: Andrew the apostle

Although Andrew is named as an apostle by Matthew, Mark and Luke, it is from John that we learn most about him. He was a Galilean fisherman who was mending his nets, when Jesus called him to be his follower. He travelled widely as a missionary and was finally crucified on an X-shaped cross. Legend tells that as his relics had originally been brought to Scotland, in the eighth century he became its patron saint. His white X-shaped cross on a blue background is the Scottish national flag – the saltire.
