

What do we show on the cover for the month of November? The Creation of Adam, the magnificent religious artwork by Michelangelo on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel, Rome, which took five years to complete, was finally revealed to the public in a solemn mass, on the 1st November, 1512, the feast of All Saints. The masterpiece includes 342 figures, and is considered to be the epitome of High Renaissance Art. Initially, the artist was reluctant to accept the commission, because he considered himself to be primarily a sculptor, who worked from his own artistic sketches, but the Pope Julius II was extremely persuasive and foresighted! Now five hundred years later, over 5 million people travel to the Vatican each year to admire this iconic work, which some see as a dramatic interpretation of the relationship between man on the left, and God on the right. Some interpret the gap between the two extended fingers, as man's inability to achieve divine perfection. God is there, but the decision to reach out to him belongs to man! Other interesting November dates! 1 November 1348 – this was the approximate date that the Black Death hit London, via ships travelling from the east, docking at Bristol and Southampton. It was also called the Bubonic Plaque, after the black, swollen inflamed lymph nodes called buboes, that appeared in the joint areas of groin and armpit of infected people. Accompanied by lethargy, bodily aches, cold and a high fever, once it entered the bloodstream the patient became poisoned and died. In just two months, around 200 bodies were piled into mass graves each day outside London. Over the next two years, the Black Death wiped out between 30 and 40 % of the entire English population. Even Princess Joan, daughter of King Edward III was a victim. Canterbury Cathedral became very popular as a pilgrimage destination. Prayers for survival were offered at the shrine of Thomas Becket. 3 November 1534 - on this date the English parliament passed the Act of Supremacy, cutting ties with the Pope in Rome and creating the Church of England, under the authority of the English monarch. This came about because Pope Clement VII refused to annul the marriage of Henry VIII and his first wife Oueen Catherine of Aragon. 4 November 1843 the 5.5 metre statue of Lord Nelson was hauled to the top of the 60 metre column in Trafalgar Square, London. This commemorated Lord Nelson's death in his decisive naval victory over Napoleon in 1815, ensuring Britain's supremacy at sea for the next 100 years, and destroying Napoleons plans to invade England. 5 November 1605, Guy Fawkes was arrested in the cellars below Westminster, while building barrels of gunpowder, after the plot to murder King James 1 was discovered. Plot organiser and devout English Catholic Robert Catesby was attempting to end the governments' persecution of Catholics. His father had been persecuted by Elizabeth I for refusing to conform to the Church of England. The plotters were later tried and executed for treason. This event is commemorated to this day, with fireworks and bonfires throughout the land.
