

POSIES FOR ALL SOULS DAY

This day has always been important in the church calendar. During his time as Rector, Father John Nice brought a more personal aspect to it, by focusing on those whose relatives' funerals were taken by the clergy in the previous year. They were invited to hear their loved one's name read out and to light a candle in memory. Some years later, the idea of purchasing posies for the service was introduced. Special forms were printed, and the posies were made up for the evening service, by a group of volunteer flower arrangers. As time went by, others within the congregations asked to be included. The idea expanded to include family and friends who had lost loved ones in previous years. Now the invitation is open to anyone, who has ever lost a loved one, and wishes to acknowledge the memory with a posy! The cost has still remained at £10, which includes a card to display alongside the flowers. This card can be printed with up to 12 words, including the names of the loved ones and of those remembering. At the end of the service, they can either be taken home, or left inside the church. Order forms will be available in each of our four churches during October, but they must please be handed in with payment by 23rd October. Enquiries to Carvs on 763027.
