**What do we show on this month's cover?** You may wonder why we feature "All Souls Day" which is celebrated on 2 Nov, on our October cover? Advertising! This year, more than any other, it will be so important for those bereaved, especially since Nov 2019, to be able to have the opportunity to fully remember their loved ones, with candles and with prayers. As the Nov PCC will be printed and distributed in early Nov, we don't want anyone to miss out—so we promote this wonderfully healing service NOW, so that people can plan ahead! **All Souls Day Service with Holy Communion (open table) – Tuesday 2 Nov – St Cybi – 7.pm. Rob**

**writes:** "There has been much loss and sadness during the pandemic and many people are in need of experiencing God's healing. This year's service will be different: we will not read out names but there will be spaces in the service for personal reflection. Those attending will have the opportunity to light a candle in memory, as they pray. As before, the candles will be placed in the chancel. At the end of the service, individual prayers for healing will be available with any one of our clergy team in our side chapel. We will not be taking bookings for the service, but Track and Trace will be needed. There will be an area of the church reserved for those wanting to be socially distanced. I will ask for people to help steward the service. There is a risk that more people will wish to come than we can safely accommodate in church. I will write a risk assessment for our Archdeacon's approval. When we reach the safe capacity calculated in advance, we will unfortunately need to turn people away. **I think it is really important this service goes ahead, safely and open to as many people as possible"** Thank you!

**On All Souls' Day**, we're talking about all souls and asking God's mercy for them. We're remembering those people we have loved, who have died before us, and their process of getting to heaven, through Christ. In some countries, it is called "the day of the dead." Historically there are inscriptions in the Roman catacombs, evidencing constant prayers for peace for the souls of the departed, which was a regular practice as far back as amongst the early Christians. Later, during medieval times, "Mummer's Plays" were sometimes performed as an All Souls Day tradition. Two main characters, St George the Christian hero and an infidel knight, would engage in combat. One was slain but revived by a doctor character with a magic potion—a typical battle between good and evil. Records trace this type of play back to at least around 1296, at the marriage feast of one of the daughters of Edward I.


