Who do we show on this month's cover? Saint Cecilia—playing a very early pipe organ. These beautiful but basic instruments, were first made in the third century before Christ, and the wind was regulated by water pressure. The oldest still playable organ, built in 1435, is to be found in Switzerland. Born in 2<sup>nd</sup> century Rome, well educated and the only child of a wealthy family, Cecilia had been a devout Christian from a very young age. She was a virgin martyr, and is the patron saint of music and musicians. Her feast day is celebrated on 22 November, but we have included her today, as our ministry area has recently been blessed with so many beautiful musical celebrations. The church of Santa Cecilia in Trastevere, Rome was probably founded in the third century by Pope Urban1, over the house were Cecilia lived and died. She is associated musically with flutes, pipe organs, violins and harps, and with singing and songbirds. Although not blind herself, she was also reputedly a protector of those who could not see. Another recent nod to St Cecilia, patron saint of music and musicians here on Holy Island has been the initiative promoted by the Royal College of Organists known as "Orgelbuchlein." In 1713 the young J S Bach wrote out the titles of 164 chorales which he intended to complete, to illustrate each facet of the church year. Sadly, he only completed 46. This 21st century project encourages composers to complete what Bach did not finish, in a modern interpretation of their choosing. The first complete performance of this marathon organ playing, took place in Amsterdam in 2019. It took nine hours, four organists and five organs to showcase the 164 musical pieces. In September 2022, five large London churches were chosen to host the next stage of the project. What has this to do with us? Bro Cybi were approached via the MA website, by Tom Bell, Director of the RCO, who along with the Fred Thomas trio, were scheduled to play at St Andrews, Holborn. Well known for his tuition and master classes around the world, Tom's playing has been described as 'invigorating, compelling, innovative and brilliant'. On holiday in our area, independent organ advisor Tom wished to use the organ at St Cybi, to practice for this prestigious event. Why? Our 250 year old organ was originally a wedding gift from her father, to the bride of the then Duke of Westminster. Tom used to be organist / choir master of St Michaels, Belgravia part of the present Duke of Westminster's London estate. We were happy to help, and those who heard him, really enjoyed the experience!

The tourist season is almost over. Thank you to all our tourist guides / stewards, including members of Rotary International, for their dedication and commitment over what has been an intense time. Nearly 40 cruise ships have visited! It is such a joy to welcome people from literally all over the world! If you missed out doing it this year, remember to get in touch, and be a trained part of the team in 2023, which promises even more cruise ships and passengers. Thanks to one of our regular organists Alec Mitchell, who has delighted guides and visitors with his music!
