What do we show on this month's cover? A magnificent window in the Stanley Chapel of St Cybi's Church, which was installed in 1921, as a war memorial to Captain Henry Robert Augustus Adeane. Known as Harry, he was killed during the first battle of Ypres, on 2 November, All Soul's Day, 1914 aged 32. The battle was fought on the Western Front in West Flanders, Belgium and between 14 October ands 30 November 1914, British casualties numbered 58,155. Captain Adeane had already retired from the Coldstream Guards in May 1913, but the day after the outbreak of WW1, in August 1914, he volunteered as a reserve officer. He has no known grave, but is commemorated on the Menin Gate Memorial in Ypres. He left a widow Victoria Eugenie, and a four year old son, Sir Michael Adeane, Baron Adeane, who went on to become Private Secretary to H.M. Queen Elizabeth II from 1953 to 1972. What is Harry's connection to the Stanley Chapel? Matilda Abigail Stanley, daughter of the first Lord Stanley, and sister to the Hon W.O. Stanley, married Henry John Adeane MP in 1828. Their son Admiral Edward Adeane was Harry's father. Harry was therefore a great nephew to the Hon W. O. Stanley, in whose memory the chapel was built. The central panel of this window from the William Morris factory, designed by chief artist John Henry Dearle, shows Saint Michael, the warrior angel, overcoming the devil. The two side panels, designed by Burne -Jones, show musician angels. Thanks to Dr Ken Roberts for his help.

Interesting Historical November Dates! On the 3rd in 1534 King Henry VIII became Supreme Head of the Church of England following the passage of the Act of Supremacy by Parliament. On the 4th in 1922 King Tut's tomb was discovered at Luxor, Egypt, by British archaeologist Howard Carter after several years of searching. The child-King Tutankhamen became pharaoh at age nine and died around 1352 B.C. at age 19. On the 4th each year, we celebrate the feast day of St Gwenfaen. Every year on the 5th we celebrate the feast day of St Cybi. On the 6th in 1942, the Church of England relaxed the rule that women must wear hats in church. On the 7th the Polish chemist Marie Curie (1867-1934) was born in Warsaw, Poland. In 1903, she and her husband received the Nobel Prize for physics for their discovery of the element Radium. On the 8th in 1895, X-rays (electromagnetic rays) were discovered by Wilhelm Roentgen at the University of Wuerzburg in Germany. On the 8th astronomer and mathematician Edmund Halley (1656-1742) was born in London. He sighted the Great Comet of 1682 (now named Halley's Comet) and foretold its reappearance in 1758. Halley's Comet appears once each generation with the average time between appearances being 76 years. It is expected to be visible again in 2061. On the 14th, in 1666 the first experimental blood transfusion took place in Britain, utilizing two dogs. On the 20th, American astronomer Edwin Hubble (1889-1953) was born in Marshfield, Missouri. He pioneered the concept of an expanding universe. The Hubble Space Telescope was named in his honour. It was deployed from the Space Shuttle Discovery in 1990, allowing astronomers to see farther into space than they had ever seen from telescopes on Earth. On the 22nd, in 1975 Juan Carlos was sworn in as King of Spain, following the death of General Franscisco Franco who had ruled as dictator since 1939.On the 24th, in 1859, Charles Darwin's book On the Origin of Species by Means of Natural Selection was first published, theorizing that all the living creatures descended from a common ancestor. On the 24th in 1874, Joseph Glidden patented his invention of barbed wire. On the 30th, Winston Churchill (1874-1965) was born in Blenheim Palace, Oxfordshire. In May 1940, he became Prime Minister.
