Have you noticed the date on the front cover image? We have been extremely fortunate to have been given a huge amount of ministry area literature and photographs by St Ffraid's historian George Lees, for which we are most grateful. These will be kept securely for the future by Chris Medley, Ministry Area Historian. What do we show on our cover for this month? One of a series of Holyhead Parish Magazines from 1933 to 1939 -note the date -January 1933! I have picked out some snippets from the whole seven year range – I hope you find them as interesting as I did! If we think we are constantly being asked for cash now, in the 1930s it was relentless. The writing style of the time was very forthright, uncompromising! Would you believe that Church bazaars invariably provided the services of a fortune teller? We might think that the churching of women was an ancient tradition, but purification after childbirth was still offered here well into the 1930s. In 1939 a request was put out to parishioners, to provide free overnight bed and board for members of a Russian choir, booked to entertain locally. In the Vicars letter of Aug 1939, the international situation was described as 'grave and unsettling'. He wrote the following month that the worst had happened, and the parish should remember in their prayers the King, soldiers, sailors, airmen and all who are actively engaged in fighting and in public service, or who were obliged to stay at home. In Oct 1939, lighting restrictions created problems for those arranging evening worship, as services had to terminate before sunset! The vicar writes that times are abnormal! Services had to be cancelled or rescheduled. The inter denominational funeral of 7 victims of the Thetis submarine tragedy was carried out on 13 Sept 1939, in Maes Hyfryd cemetery. A welcome was extended to war refugees who were settling well into their new homes. Prayers were offered for those absent on active service. We might think that our worship has been disrupted by the recent Pandemic. Imagine the concern of those terrified and unwilling to leave home after dark, lest an air raid warning should be sounded and total panic should set in. The windows of St Elbods (Rhos y Gaer Ave—now closed) and St Cybi had to be darkened, so that no light should betray the site. Evensong had to be moved to the afternoon for reasons of safety. The ladies of the church working parties met each Thursday from the outset of WW2, to knit "comforts" for the three sectors of the military. At Christmas 1939, Christmas boxes were sent to all serving members of our congregations. Mrs Charles Hughes' band was mentioned as a regular provider of entertainment, while plays and whist drives continued to raise funds to help with the support element of our local war effort. Falling church numbers are not new. In 1939 the vicar in his letter criticised the neglect of public worship, but remarked that it was a busy, lively parish with lots going on. Although these events and similar happened more than eighty years ago, some present church members may remember them being talked about within the older generations of the family. If you have similar church memories to share, do please get in touch!


