What do we show on our cover? This month, during our popular coastal holiday season, we feature the magnificent underwater bronze statue of Christ, being visited by a deep sea diver. The original was created in 1954 by sculptor Guido Galetti, and stands on the seabed only 15 metres below sea level, in the waters off San Fruttuoso, near Portofino, on the Italian Riviera. It was commissioned by legendary Italian diver Duilio Marcante, in memory of his friend Dario Gonzatti, who died during a dive on that same spot, a few years previously. Christ is portrayed with arms outstretched, as a sign of invocation. It stands 2.5 meters high, without the plinth, and weighs 260 kgs. It has been recently restored to preserve it from further corrosion, and the hand has been reattached, having been previously damaged by an anchor. It is visited by scuba divers from all over the world. Diving centres in the village of San Fruttuoso, have been guick to realise the commercial benefits. Because the water is so shallow, diving to the statue is not that difficult. A secondary reason for the dive, is that quite near to the statue, is the remains of a British ship that sank during the Crimean war. Annually on the last Saturday in July, San Fruttuoso holds a local ceremony, which includes the blessing of the sea and the lighting of candles along the bay. There are several other replicas around the world, created from the original mould. If you are a landlubber, there is another identical statue featured in the church of San Fruttuoso. There is yet another in Lombardy, in Lake Palu, in Chiesa di Valmalenco. Here the statue is not always submerged. During a ceremony at the beginning of each summer, the statue is placed on the lake's seabed until the end of summer, when it is removed. The original cast of the statue is to be found inside the National Museum of Under Water Activities, in Ravenna, also in Italy. The most popular replica of the statue, cast from the same mould, and popular with both divers and snorkelers, can be found off the shore of Key Largo, Florida, USA in the John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park. The statue stands about 10 feet beneath sea level, and can be visited all the year round. It was placed there in 1965 and has since been encrusted with sponges and corals. A smaller copy of the statue can be found next to the city of St Georges, the capital city of the Caribbean nation Granada. It will be interesting to know which of our readers have seen any of these statues!

Meanwhile, as they have family in Anglesey, he has said, to quote The Terminator "I'll be back!"

Interesting August Date: Every year, on the last Sunday in August, in the pretty village of Eyam in Derbyshire, a special service is held to remember Bubonic Plague Sunday. In 1665 George Vicars, the village tailor took delivery of a parcel of cloth from London. Because it was damp, he dried it in front of the fire, not realising it was full of plaque infested fleas. He died one week later. The rector and curate decided to isolate the village, to prevent contagion to other areas. The Earl of Devonshire, who lived in nearby Chatsworth House, generously donated food and medical supplies. Any other requirements were delivered to a well near the boundary stones. Coins were left as payment, and these were disinfected by soaking in vinegar. Church services were held in the openair, to avoid contamination. The plaque lasted for 14 months, and two thirds of the villagers died. Many of the homes remain haunted to this day, including the local pub and the rectory! The nursery rhyme "Ring a ring of roses" was supposedly written about this disease, describing the circular shape of the rash, the flowers carried to remove the foul smell, the sneezing and the sudden eventual death!

All will be very welcome at our Walsingham Mass at 11.30 am on Saturday, 13 August, at St Cybi, whether you are a seasoned pilgrim, just curious or eniov the smell of incense and the sound of bells.
